Re: Equifax Breach

According to MSN approximately 143 million consumers were affected by a breach at Equifax between May 2017 and July 2017. Information at risk is: name, social security number, date of birth, address and some driver license numbers. Also approx. 209,000 consumers' credit card numbers and dispute documents may have been accessed.

This is not a breach of Fahey Bank, but we would like to help guide our customers on the actions they should take to protect themselves.

Equifax has stated it will NOT send emails to affected consumers. They will only send paper letters to consumers whose credit card numbers or dispute documents may have been accessed.

Fahey Bank advises those who were affected to do the following to help protect themselves:

- Go to Experian or TransUnion and pull credit reports to monitor
- Do NOT click on any links in emails
- Change any passwords that are similar to one you may have used with Equifax
- If available use multi-factor authentication on email, bank accounts, and credit card accounts
- Change your security questions and answers on email, bank accounts, and credit card accounts
- Secure your email account as best you can
- Watch your credit card and bank account activity closely
